How to get to the hotel

Our hotel is located at 1 place des Albigeois, in the heart of the historic centre of Béziers, a 10-minute walk from the town centre, 15 minutes from the train station and 5 minutes by car from Béziers Cap d'Agde airport.

If you arrive in Béziers from the Canal du Midi, we invite you to take the magnificent "Liaison douce" walkway linking the Pont Vieux, where you can admire a postcardperfect view of Béziers, to the upper part of the town. You'll need to take 3 lifts to get to us.

At the hotel, ask our receptionists who will be delighted to welcome you and guide you with your bikes.

Please note that our hotel is fully equipped to meet your bicycle parking needs. We understand the importance of keeping your bike secure, which is why we have set up special facilities for you. We have a secure room where you can recharge your electric bikes...




Bicycle parking in Béziers

Cycling itinerary The Canal des 2 Mers

From the Atlantic to the Mediterranean by bike...

From Royan to Sète, a superb cycle route of over 700 km links the Atlantic to the mediterranean: the Canal des 2 mers by bike. This exceptional route crosses the southwest of France, taking in such jewels as Bordeaux, Moissac, Toulouse, the Canal du Midi, the Minervois and Carcassonne. You can cycle all or part of it, at the weekend or on holiday, with friends or family, and always at your own pace.

There are 5 routes:

From Royan to Bordeaux 151km

From Bordeaux to Agen 154 km

From Agen to Toulouse 127 km

From Toulouse to Carcassonne.

And then from Carcassonne to Béziers, then on to Sète!

Before setting off, we recommend that you find out all about the different routes and their levels of difficulty. There are many detailed guides to help you on your journey.



The Véloccitanie

An itinerary of small pleasures...

This new cycle route links the Canal du Midi, the farmlands of the Lauragais region, the landscapes of the Haut-Languedoc Regional Nature Park (vineyards, cliffs, forests, rivers, meadows...) and, via

the PassaPaïs, the wine-growing plains of many of Hérault's famous appellations.

When all is said and done, you'll be cycling more than 200 kilometres from the Seuil de Naurouze to Béziers, discovering a wide variety of natural and cultural heritage - enough to give you a breath of fresh air on two wheels.

Look out for the simple pleasures to be shared along the way, depending on what you feel like doing at the time




The Mediterranean by bike

A unique experience to enjoy the South of France...

Linking the Pyrenees to the Alps and Spain to Italy via the back roads of France is the ambition of La Méditerranée à vélo.

The French section of EuroVelo 8, La Méditerranée à vélo first climbs the Pyrenees via a section of the Catalan Pirinexus route.

This cycle route is a new way of discovering the Mediterranean arc at your own pace. Combining the sea, mountains, lakes, marshes, canals and a sublime heritage, a legacy of the Roman Empire common to the Mediterranean rim, the promise of this beautiful route is to link Le Perthus to Menton on an 850km adventure bike route.



Ideas for walks

A few ideas for walks around our beautiful town of Béziers


• A walk along the Béziers vineyards

This is a beautiful scenic route, discovering sun-drenched wine producing villages perched on hilltops, nestling in valleys or clustered around châteaux.

There are plenty of vineyards, but almond and olive trees also line the small, pleasant roads along the route. You can make a diversion to the beautiful church of Notre-Dame des Pins, near Espondeilhan.









• A walk along the Orb valley

The route begins in the hills of the Haut-Languedoc, as far as Berlou, before following the course of the Orb and its picturesque valley. A veritable jewel of the Haut-Languedoc, it winds its way through evergreen oaks, vineyards and olive groves, wine-growing plains at the foot of the Caroux and reveals the remarkable architecture of its villages and market towns, which tell us a great deal about the history of this region.

From Vieussan to Cessenon, you'll discover the deepest part of the river and its steep gorges, shaped by nature over thousands of years..

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
• A walk south of the Canal du Midi

This magnificent 27km itinerary is a real compendium of the best that nature and heritage have to offer in the region.

Just listen on your bike, you'll discover the wonders of the Canal du Midi, the 9 locks at Fonseranes, the Orb bridge-canal, the Malpas tunnel, the port of Colombiers, the Vendres lake...

And if you're feeling brave, you can also try climbing up to the Ensérune oppidum and overlooking the surprising dry pond at Montady.






• From the Camargue to the Canal du Midi

This itinerary will take you on a cycling tour of the Camargue along the Mediterranean coast.

The Camargue, a land of contrasts and diversity, offers a unique harmony between its vast salt marshes, lush green rice fields and stretches of coastal dunes. This emblematic region of France also boasts a wealth of wildlife, with white Camargue horses and pink flamingos living in perfect harmony...

Departing from our hotel, you'll follow the Canal du Midi to Portiragnes, where you'll pass through Vias and the Roman town of Agde, before continuing to Marseillan, where you can take a short diversion to admire the Etang de Thau. Then, between the lake and the sea, continue to Sète. You might even catch a glimpse of the famous jousting matches or try a tielle Sétoise!

The second part of the route continues to waver between the Mediterranean and the lakes as far as Aigues Mortes, then enters the Bouches du Rhône to cross the magnificent Camargue as far as Saintes Maries de la Mer.

Getting around by bike

By train:

On TER (regional trains), you can take your unmounted bike on board free of charge and without reservation, subject to availability.

On TGV, Intercités and OUIGO trains, some lines offer paying spaces for unmounted bikes, <u>but a reservation</u> is <u>required</u>. If this service is not available, you must dismantle your bike and put it in a cover.

Transporting a dismantled bike - bag: for lines without bike racks, you must store your bike in a bag measuring no more than 90x120cm (at no extra charge).

Please note: Special features during the summer: during the summer period, some regions and lines set up reservation systems, even on TER trains.

Price:

Intercités with unmounted bike stands cost varies between €5 and €10 depending on the line.

TGV line: some lines accept bicycles on board in special spaces. This service is subject to a charge (\in 10) and is only available by reservation. TER line: most TER lines allow you to take your bike with you free of charge, subject to availability.



By bus:

Only folding bicycles are accepted on BEEMOB buses in the conurbation.

On certain lines, such as A, B, C, D, E, H, K, P, J and L, there are special areas for transporting bicycles. These are indicated by "bicycle" pictograms on the doors. These spaces are subject to availability and cannot be reserved.
